Job Summary

The Nechako partner Nations (Lheidli T'enneh, Saik'uz, Nadleh Whut'en and Stelat'en First Nations) are seeking reliable, motivated individuals to join the Nation Monitor program in support of the BC Hydro North Coast Transmission Line Project (NCTL). This role will help protect lands, waters, wildlife, culturally important areas, and the community interests while supporting responsible development within traditional territories.

- Monitor water crossings, wetlands, wildlife, and sensitive areas
- Report erosion, spills, sedimentation, or disturbances

Salary & Benefits

- Wage: \$30 per hour
- Full benefits after 3 months
- This is a full-time position, two-year term, up to 70 hours bi-weekly. Normal hours are 8:30 am to 4:00 pm or as scheduled but it is expected that the incumbent manages workload and demand to maximize service to Saik'uz First Nation.
- The position does not compensate for overtime, however, compensatory time off for overages of hours of work can be taken with the permission of the General Manager.
